The Golden Goose Award's second year was successful in increasing congressional engagement, achieving stronger name recognition for the Award, and obtaining greater sponsorship participation. Work has already begun to further elevate the profile and prestige of the award in 2014.

MEDIA, WHITE HOUSE, AND CONGRESSIONAL ATTENTION:

The Golden Goose Award increased its presence in the press last year, with several published news stories on the award. 2013 saw Golden Goose related articles published by NPR, FOX News, The Scientist, Inside Higher Ed, Digital Journal, and Pacific Standard, among others. In addition to these articles, there was greater social media interest, and there were blog postings and press releases from the White House, Members of the Senate and the House, as well as Congressional letters encouraging other Members of Congress to support the award. WEBSITE ANALYTICS:

The Golden Goose Award presence online also grew in 2013. The website analytics for www.goldengooseaward.org highlight the volume of additional interest in the award this year at a visitor increase of 124% from 2012 to 2013.

The GGA site received a 50% increase in the amount of visits from mobile and tablet devices, supporting our decision to design the site with a mobile friendly platform. Nearly 20% of site visitors identify as frequent users of the GGA site. The largest number of visits have come from the United States, Canada, Italy and China in that order, showing an increased interest abroad as well as nationally.

GOLDEN GOOSE AWARD CEREMONY

This year's Award ceremony was held at the Reserve Officer's Association, located on Capitol Hill in Washington, DC. Attendance was approximately 30% higher than the previous year. The ceremony in 2012 was very well attended and was a standing room only event. Despite the larger venue for this year's ceremony, by the end it was again standing room only. Guests included Members of Congress, congressional staff, media, and individuals from the science, education, and business communities. SPONSORSHIPS

The Golden Goose Award is possible only because of the generous support of its sponsors. Several new organizations sponsored the award in 2013. This was in addition to all of the organizations that supported the award in 2012. Award sponsorships in 2013 totaled \$83,500 (\$67,500 for the award itself, and \$16,000 in video sponsorships.) This reflects a 46.7% increase in sponsorship funding from 2012 (not including the Lounsbery Foundation start-up grant received in 2012).



The Golden Goose Award is already gearing up for another successful award season in 2014.

In February 2014, the Golden Goose Award will be the subject of a session at the American Association for the Advancement of Science annual meeting in Chicago, with a potential audience of 2,000 members of the research community, the media, and others interested in science and technology. The goal of the session is to bring greater attention to the Award and its mission, as well to demonstrate the bipartisan support in Congress not only for the Award but for federally funded basic research.
